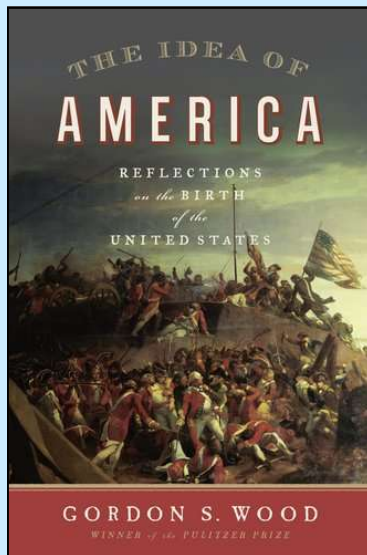

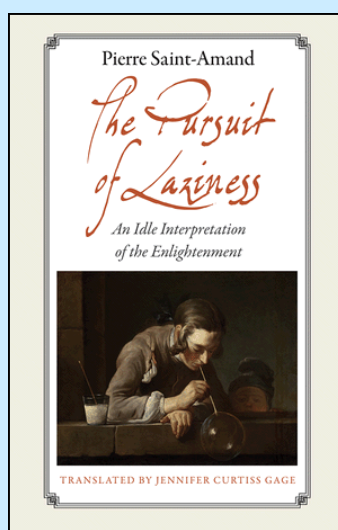
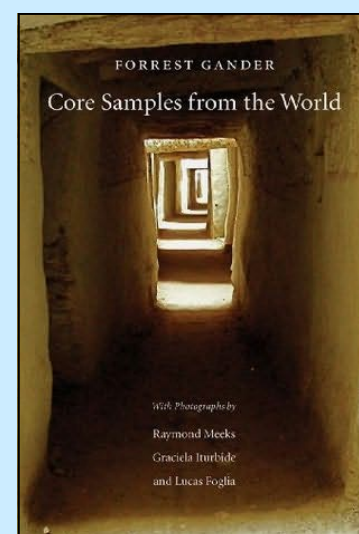


**The Idea of America**
