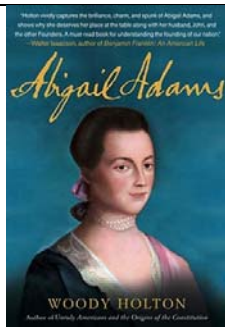


The Disappeared

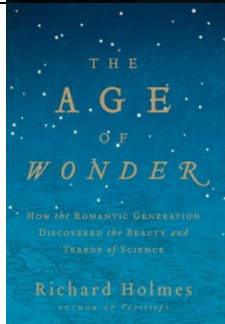


Abigail Adams: A Life

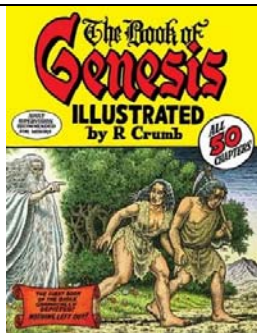


The Age of Wonder
